Once Upon a Marigold by Jean Ferris

Ed is a troll who lives in the royal forest. Christian (age 6) appears in the forest one day, a handsome boy in a velvet suit who refuses to tell Ed where he lives and also refuses to go home. So Christian grows up with a troll for a father.

Christian loves to invent things, including a telescope he uses to watch the goings on in King Swithbert's castle. In particular he lives to watch the young, dark-haired princess, who looks so lonely that he starts corresponding with her – by P-mail (carried by the messenger pigeons Ed raises). Christian and Princess Marigold become fast friends. Then, after 11 Years with Ed, Christian, now 17 years old, heads across the river to get a job in King Swithbert's court and be closer to his princess.
